

It would take more than one WASCA Festival for dancers to promenade their partners along the 2,448 miles, 8 states and 3 time zones that comprise Route 66, also called 'America's Highway', the 'Mother Road' and the 'Will Rogers Highway'.

The iconic Route 66 was established on November 11, 1926 as one of the original highways in the U.S. highway system. It started in Chicago, at Michigan Ave. and Jackson Blvd., and ended in Santa Monica, on the shores of the Pacific Ocean. It runs through Illinois, Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona and California. Traveled by millions, it followed Interstate 60 through the Western states. Although only 800 miles were paved in 1926, by 1937, it was paved end-to-end.

In 'Grapes of Wrath', John Steinbeck called it the 'Mother Road' because it offered a route to the migrants fleeing the Dust Bowl storms as they moved West seeking jobs. After the Depression, it became a source for adventure, probably due to Nat King Cole's 1946 hit 'Get Your Kicks on Route 66'. Depeche Mode and the Rolling Stones recorded later versions.

Fun Facts

In 1928, promoters held a coastto-coast foot race that included all 2,448 miles and a few extra. The race went from West to East, then continued all the way to New York City.

In 1956, legislation created the Interstate System, funding five new highways to bypass Rte. 66: I-55, I-44, I-40, I-15 and I-10. Eventually the familiar black and white shield-shaped markers were removed, the last one in Chicago on January 17, 1977. The highway was officially decommissioned in 1985. Today, some of the physical road is unpaved and impassable; however, drivers can follow 'Historic Route 66' which parallels interstate highways in many states. Although Oklahoma had the most miles originally, Arizona has the longest remaining stretch still in use.

In true American TV style, the route even had a series named after it, a drama spun off ABC's 'Naked City'. It followed two young men crossing the US in a baby-blue Corvette convertible, and every show was shot on location. The car joined the road in the public's imagination of experiencing both driving and adventure.

The highway is commemorated in the Smithsonian exhibit 'American on the Move', which includes an actual piece of Rte. 66 pavement.trip (get your kicks on Route 66).

Won't you get hip to this timely tip When you make that California trip Get your kicks on Route sixty six Bobby Troup got the idea for the song on a cross-country drive from Pennsylvania to California. Troup wanted to try his hand as a Hollywood songwriter, so he and his wife, Cynthia, packed up their 1941 Buick and headed west. The trip began on US 40 and continued along US 66 to the California coast. Troup initially considered writing a tune about US 40, but Cynthia suggested the title "Get Your Kicks on Route 66". The song was composed on the ten-day journey, and completed by referencing maps when the couple arrived in Los Angeles. The lyrics read as a mini-travelogue about the major stops along the route, listing several cities and towns through which Route 66 passes,

CHOREO CORNER



with Dick Otis

The Corner Box

In the February – March issue of Choreo Corner we did an analysis of the Diamond Circulate family. This month rather than focus on a specific call, I'm going to focus on equivalents for the call Square Thru Four.

As a dancer and later as a caller, I felt that Square Thru 4 is overused. Many singing calls, and for some callers many pattern tips, leverage the call Square Thru 4. The reason is the call is actually a little minimodule that, from a Squared Set, results in a formation called a Corner Box (or Zero Box), from which you can call Allemande Left (and Promenade home if required).

Note: there are LOTS of things you can do with the call Square Thru; I'm only taking about an opening module to start the dancers moving.

In the Advance program, Callerlab provides a quick short cut for Square Thru 4, called "Pair Off" which is defined as "step to the center and face out of their box". Compared to Square Thru 4 which takes 10 beats from a static square (8 beats from facing couples), Heads Pair Off only required 4 beats to get to a Corner Box. Pair Off is very handy if the dancers get behind in a singing call pattern. I'm not sure why it is on the Advance Program list, but I teach it and use it with my seniors!

In order to provide variety to the dancers, callers often use an equivalent, or a series of short calls, to achieve the same result as Square Thru Four. Most of them use just Basic/Mainstream calls.

Here are some Square Thru Four equivalent routines (Start with a designated active couple, e.g. Heads or Sides):

- 1. Touch 1/4, Boys Run
- 2. Right & Left Thru, Roll Away, Star Thru
- 3. Pass The Ocean, GIRLS Trade, Recycle, Pass Thru

In order to be effective the equivalent module needs to be short so that the caller can remember it, and so the OTHER couple (the non-active couple) is

not standing for a long time doing nothing. Here are some other examples:

- 4. Dixie Style to A Wave, Recycle, Pass Thru
- 5. Dixie Style to A Wave, Centers Trade, Explode, Slide Thru, Pass Thru
- 6. Pass Thru, Wheel Around, Half Sashay, Slide Thru
- 7. Turn Thru, Sep Around 1 and Into The Middle, Left Turn Thru

There are dozens and dozens of short modules which are equivalent to Square Thru 4. There are way to many to list them all in this article. Some are simple, some are more challenging Here are a few more:

- 8. Touch 1/4 & Roll, Slide Thru
- 9. Reverse Flutter Wheel, Lead Left
- 10. Reverse Flutter Wheel, Dixie Style to a Wave, Pass Thru
- 11. Single Circle To A Wave, Explode and U Turn Back

And just for fun using my favorite call, Crossfire:

12. Pass The Ocean, Very Center Girls Trade & U-Turn Back, Crossfire, Walk and Dodge

Most dancers easily execute most of these calls. I hope you will try them out (or encourage your caller to try them out). Good luck!


