# The Editor's Desk 

Hello Everybody.
Welcome to the first online only issue of Calls ' N ' Cues. It is available in two forms. The first is an online reader version produced by QuarkXPress. The other is a conventional .pdf file which can be downloaded and viewed or printed out.

With the ending of paper issues, I am beginning to make electronic format changes. The first change will not be obvious to most readers, but has very significant benefits. As background, for the last many years Calls'N'Cues has been printed on both sides of a folded $81 / 2$ "x $11^{\prime \prime}$ sheet. Therefore each individual page was $51 / 2 " \mathrm{x} 81 / 2$ " and each issue required a multiple of four pages. That meant that when submissions came in using $81 / 2$ "x11" formats (which was just about anything.) manual operations were required to put them on an $51 / 2 \mathrm{x} \times \mathrm{x}^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ page. With issue I am converting to an $81 / 2$ " $\times 11$ " format. Since the online reader automatically fills the window being used, there is basically no difference in what readers see. However when you ask your browser to print a page you will get a full $81 / 2$ "x11" page printout. Similarly any .pdf printouts will be full pages.

Now that Calls'N'Cues is formatted as a full page I am going to add two new sections: Club Dance Schedules and Special Dance Flyers. The first section will include any "camera ready" full page club dance schedule flyers electronically submitted to me. These schedule flyers will continue to be included in all issues until they are out of date. The second section will include any "camera ready" full page flyers for special dances which are electronically submitted to me. These dance flyers will continue to be included until the dance is held. These sections will NOT replace Club News or Calendar of Events. But be aware, I will not use the full page club dance schedules in making Calendar of Events entries.

That segues nicely into other sections. At this stage I have resolved how the various columns, authored articles, "centerfold", Club News, Calendar of Events, Club Dance Schedules, and Special Dance Flyers will be formatted. There are still a few sections I need to work on, but I didn't have the time to do it for this issue. They include handling pictures in Club News and developing a National Convention and Festival News column. To that end I would like to have someone who could write column(s) on both MDSDF SSB and VASARDA. I also need to decide how best to format the "Under the Weather", "Dance Classes", and "Birthdays \& Anniversaries",

Several people have asked me how to find things in the electronic copies. While there is no text search ability in the QuarkXPress online reader, it has the ability to jump to a specific page. When you are on any given page, (say the What's Inside This Month page) click on the page
number. That will raise a slide bar. Then move the cursor up a bit and you will see thumbnails of all the pages, along with page numbers. You can then click on any specific page and jump directly to the desired page. The other option is to download the .pdf file and use a local reader to search for things. I have seen some hints I should be able to set up the .pdf files that QuarkXPress produces such that the table of contents becomes clickable. Right now I have too many other things to learn about Quark, however that is in my list of things to do.

Related to online viewing, there are those who would consider me a luddite. I have neither a smart phone nor a tablet, only a flip phone. On a couple of occasions I have borrowed both to see if the online version comes up and it does. However, I have not played with them enough to know how well it works on them. Would anyone who encounters an anomaly please take me aside at some dance and show it to me. (Emailing me will not suffice as I will need to see the problem and play with it for a while).

And with that I need to get back to making this issue.

We hope all of you have had a great summer and enjoyed a chance to dance at some of your favorite events. You may recall that at the May 5, 2019 delegates meeting we requested suggestions on how WASCA could show appreciation to the clubs. We have received a number of interesting suggestions. A couple of these related to www.wheresthedance.com (WTD), the suggestion being that WASCA should help in improving the accuracy of club information on the WTD site.

The FAQ on the site addresses why the site was created. The short version is that it helps dancers find dances that they may otherwise be unaware of and the ability to find dancing when traveling. The site also lists conventions and festivals. (Check out the WASCA Spring Festival for 2020.)

Early in the life of WTD WASCA worked to get WASCA clubs listed as "Charter Clubs". This was considered important since the information provided at the time was that charter clubs would never be charged a fee to be listed on WTD. Non-Charter Member clubs would be assessed a fee of $\$ 25$ per year for inclusion. Charter clubs would have their yearly fee waived on Jan 1 each year that they have dance events listed on the WTD calendar on that date.

We don't know what current policy is, however, there are Charter Clubs that remain listed on WTD and have not listed a dance event for years. Some of these clubs are large, operate an up to date and attractive web site and Facebook page and list their future dances on other Federation sites but have no future dances listed on WTD. It would seem such clubs do not see an advantage in listing their dances on WTD.

Another attractive feature of WTD is the ability to make changes related to a specific dance quickly. (Under

normal circumstances WTD can be updated in just a few minutes.) When faced with a change in dance location, start time, staff or the need to cancel a day before or even a few hours before the dance the preferred action is to get the updated information to as many places as possible. We have seen examples where clubs that use multiple channels of communication and typically keep WTD up to date had to cancel or move a dance with only a few hours before the dance. In some cases WTD is the last thing to be changed or is not changed at all. This seems to indicate that WTD is not viewed by these clubs as an effective communication tool for last minute changes.

We thought that clubs that were not listing future dances might just not have someone available to enter the required data. It now appears that the picture may be more complex, but the sample size we have looked at is small. So, we hope to take an additional look at this issue over the next couple of months.

On a different subject, in the last CallsNCues we predicted that this years National Convention would be the largest since 2012. We missed by a year. It is the largest since 2013. The three conventions since 2012 with the largest attendance are:

2019 Atlanta 4063,
2013 Oklahoma City 4185,
2012 Spokane 5545

Contracts will be sent to previous advertisers as well as all clubs, callers and cuers in the WASCA area. There are ad contracts in all the delegates' packets you will receive at the Delegates' September meeting.

If you haven't participated in the advertising campaign previously, now is a great time to start. We need everyone to help make this Festival great and we need the money we raise from the advertising to help do that. Does your club eat out before or after a dance? Ask the restaurant if they would place an ad in the program book. Do you have a small business? Advertise it in our program book. How about thanking someone in your club by placing an ad with a personal message? There are so many ways to support WASCA with a simple ad. Don't wait until December to begin the process or you will miss the deadline. Start today - don't procrastinate. Let's see if anyone can sell eight business card size ads - that equals one page and brings in $\$ 200$ vs selling one full page ad for $\$ 100$. See what combinations of ads you can sell to fill a page.

The ad sizes range from business card size $(\$ 25)$ to full page $(\$ 100)$. You can design your ad copy or we can help you with it. If you design your own ad, please look at the requirements on the ad contract so your ad will be truly camera ready. Don't wait too long to begin the process because it does take time to get the program book put together. The sooner you contact an advertiser, the better chance of getting an ad. Local businesses are always looking for opportunities to get their name in front of potential customers. The deadline for submitting your contract, payment, and ad copy is January 6, 2020.

# Get Your Kicks On Route 66! 

## Illinois

When US 66, the 'Main Street of America' was designated on November 11, 1926, the original route included mostly pre-existing roads in order to minimize construction and open 66 to traffic as soon as possible. Illinois, the first of eight states through which 66 passed, had already paved most of the roads that would comprise US 66; much of the rest of the now-iconic route was still a gravel-and-dirt road. Thus, let us begin with Illinois as the first stop where we get our kicks.

The first known Chicago-to-St. Louis road was an earlier Native American Indian trail and stagecoach road, renamed the Pontiac Trail in 1915. Route 66, once outside the metropolitan Chicago area, traveled down the Pontiac Trail through many cities and towns on its way southwest, including Joliet, Odell, Bloomington, Lincoln, Springfield, Edwardsville and East St. Louis. IL 4 coincided with most of the Pontiac Trail and closely paralleled the Chicago and Alton Railroad tracks running from Chicago to East St. Louis. In 1922, teams of horses dragging equipment behind them prepared the roadbed for IL 4. Laborers earned $40 \phi / \mathrm{hr}$. to perform backbreaking labor on the roadbed. The next year, concrete was poured in Bloomington-Normal. By 1924, IL 4 was almost entirely paved between Chicago and St. Louis. Construction on the few remaining parts of US 66 in Illinois began in 1926.

In 1930, the Chain of Rocks Bridge was opened on Bypass US 66 to circumvent St. Louis. The Luna Cafe, Bel-Air Drive-In sign, and the Old Greenway Motel can be found along this stretch of road, as well as The Mustang Corral, a Ford Mustang shop, just before IL 157 on the right hand side eastbound. eastbound.

In Illinois and throughout the Midwest, the construction of US 66 had a serious impact on the economies of small, rural towns; these smaller communities witnessed a hive of new activity when the road finally passed through. Previously, in 1916, the Congressional Federal Aid Post Road Act, known as the Shackleford Bill, appropriated $\$ 75$ million to states over the next five years, and the federal government became actively involved in road building for the first time. Five roads in Illinois were designated to receive federal money under the legislation; they were: the National Old Trails Road (National Road, present-day US 40), Lincoln Highway, Dixie Highway, the road from Chicago to Waukegan, and the road from Chicago to East St. Louis, including portions of IL 4, which was the actual predecessor to US 66 in Illinois.

By the 1930s, US 66 extended from Chicago through Springfield to St. Louis; most of the original pavement was used at late as early 1940. However, the dangers of the original pavement led to the nickname "Bloody 66," due to the frequently deadly road accidents along the mostly rural route. By World War II, Route 66 had become the heaviest trafficked highway in Illinois; the increase in military traffic hastened the aging road's deterioration. The Defense Highway Act of 1941 provided Illinois with about \$400,000 in funding, and by 1942, plans were in place to make much needed road repairs that were also intended in part to make the road safer for traffic.

Route 66 originally followed IL 4 north of Hamel; the section of US 66/IL 4 from Nilwood to Girard was listed on the National Register of Historic Places on May 23, 2002. Passing north of Auburn and south of Springfield is the last brick alignment in Illinois. Finally, breaking off of IL 4, the route passed the Illinois State Capitol and the Old State Capitol

An alternate route northward from Hamel was opened in 1930. It branched off to the east, bypassing Staunton, and moved northeast through Mount Olive.

The highway continued past Litchfield, through Livingston, to Springfield and on to Atlanta, the home of the famous Dixie Travel Plaza. This full service restaurant, dubbed 'A Palace for Kings of the Road' was inducted into the Illinois Route 66 Association Hall of Fame for its contribution to the character of Route 66.

Funks Grove to the north featured the Funk family's 'pure maple sirup'. Continuing northeast to Bloomington and Towanda, the route is now a parkway and trail where travelers can see classic Burma Shave signs.

Going onward towards Pontiac, the road between Cayuga and Chenoa is particularly interesting: some portions of the northbound lanes have been abandoned, while the southbound lanes still carry traffic. There 14 structures and buildings remain along this 18.2 mile stretch, eight of which are historic listings. There are also 12 highway bridges, all of concrete, and a 'box culvert': a cast-in-place or pre-cast reinforced concrete and has a box shape that is located under the embankment to drain water from one side of the road to the other.

The section to Joliet, mostly agricultural, is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Joliet itself boasts of many historic structures: The Rialto Theatre, a movie palace; Joliet Union Station, an example of the Beaux Arts style; several Art Deco structures and the first Dairy Queen, opened in 1940.

The summer of 2020 is now history, Trish and I have traveled far and wide this summer, and we are excited to get back to the regular dance season.

I'm writing this article from the beautiful Pride RV Campgrounds in Maggie Valley, NC where we are continuing our own dancing education under the tutorage of Jerry Story and Tony Oxendine. If you are interested in taking a peek at what they do, drop by my YouTube channel, www.youtube.com/SquareDancers and check it out!

Recently, Callerlab updated the Plus Program list and some Plus definitions. Two calls were moved to other levels (Extend and 3/4 Tag) giving us 28 calls on the list. One definition that changed is Crossfire. This is one of my favorite calls which, when Trish and I were learning Plus, we rarely heard called at a dance. When I asked callers why they didn't call Crossfire many answered, because the dancers can't do it. I thought that was a strange answer. Of course if nobody used the call then dancers would not be able to dance it. Happily, I now hear it called more often (or if not I ask them to call it!). So let's take a closer look at my favorite call. From Callerlab's Plus Definition (September 22, 2018).
"CROSSFIRE - Starting formation - Two faced line, Parallel lines of four, Inverted Line(s). TIMING - 6

As the centers begin to Trade, the ends Cross Fold. Upon completing their Trade, the centers release hands and step straight forward forming an ocean wave or miniwave with the dancers they are facing. If the Trade leaves the original centers facing no one, they step forward and remain facing out."

There are two points in the definition that Callerlab is clarifying. The first point is that Crossfire is a two-part call, the first part is "As the centers begin to Trade, the ends Cross Fold" and the second part is "centers release hands and step straight forward forming an ocean wave or mini-wave".

The second point of clarification is "forming an ocean wave or mini-wave". Specifically, from outfacing lines, the Centers of the line partner trade and step forward into an Ocean wave in the middle, while the ENDS cross-fold to become partners on the outside (e.g. a 1/4 Tag formation).

I won't go into the caller discussions about Crossfire about this change to the definition. As the definition is now
changed the arguments are moot and to most of us it doesn't matter anyway. So let's see what we can do with the call.
(1) First, from a two-faced line, which is probably how you were originally taught the call, Crossfire results in a right or left-hand column (depending on if the two-face starting line is right or left handed). Interestingly from this position, the caller can call Coordinate and then Crossfire again in an infinite do-loop (not recommended).

This gives us the first two (common) ways to call Crossfire (left and right two-faced lines), with many variations of arrangement (boy-girl, girl-boy, boy-boy etc.)
(2) Secondly as discussed above, from out-facing lines, the Centers of the line partner trade and step forward into a (right hand) Ocean wave in the middle, while the ENDS cross fold to become partners on the outside. The end result is a $1 / 4 \mathrm{Tag}$ formation.
(3) Third, from in-facing lines, the Centers of the line partner trade and step forward as a couple, while the Ends of the line cross fold, to stand behind them in a completed double pass thru formation.
(4) From out-verted lines (e.g. the Ends of the line are facing out, and the Centers are facing in) the Centers will Partner Trade while the Ends cross fold and then extend to form right hand waves.

When you add in different arrangements (which positions are occupied by a boy or girl) and relationships (which one of the 4 girls is adjacent to a reference boy dancer) there is a rich collection of ways to call Crossfire.

And there you have all the ways to do Crossfire, there are no other ways; well at least from the Callerlab specified starting formations.

Just for fun, let's look at a couple of other possibilities which we can do if we are calling a Dance By Definition (DBD) dance - or more likely a workshop. From the definition all we need to call Crossfire are centers and ends.
(5) If we have a 4X4 tidal wave (e.g. two couples together in a line on one end, and two couples together on the other end, then we have centers and ends (of each line). Crossfire from this formation results in a parallel two-faced lines.
(6) If we have Facing Diamonds then of course we have centers and ends, so using the definition, we can call Crossfire. For a formation with the Boys in the wave and the Girls as points it works like this.

The center of the diamonds (Boys) do the trade and extend to look out of the box of 4 , while the points of the diamond (Girls) do the cross-fold to look into the box; the ending is a T-Bone box formation.

## Square Dancing in China Square dancing is an annoyance no more in Nanning community

While it's commonplace for Chinese square dancing to be accompanied by loud music, one group of older dancers in Nanning has decided to turn off the loudspeakers without turning down their fun.

Tired of noise complaints, the Nanning Dream Team ditched the speakers and added individual headsets to make sure they can still enjoy dancing in the community, but in what to neighbors must be a more civilized way.

In a city square in Nanning, South China's Guangxi Zhuang autonomous region, nearly 100 seniors concentrated on following the moves of their dance leader while wearing headsets to listen to the music.

Many passersby did a double take when they saw the dance team go through a routine, seemingly without any audible music blaring from loudspeakers.

When asked why they dance in this way, they said they had no other choice.- The area where they dance is between two close residential buildings, so noise echoed and disturbed nearby residents.

Surrounding merchants and residents used to complain about the noise they made. Some even splashed water or threw items from the upstairs floors of buildings close by.

The team leader, surnamed Yang, said the dancers didn't want to annoy the neighbors, and that's why she suggested the group dance with headsets.

This perfect solution has ended complaints, simply via a small transmitter which can set channels and transmit the signals, creating the music all the dancers listen to simultaneously.
"I bought the device at my own expense, while our dancers pay for their own headsets," Yang said. "Dancers can adjust the volume of their wireless headset and select stereo mode, which is very beneficial for us to enjoy dancing and not disturb others anymore. What a win-win solution!"

The move has impressed many in the neighborhood. A female resident surnamed Wen, owner of a snack counter opposite the square, has witnessed several conflicts in the past and said she's very happy the seniors have solved the problem.

Before the new technology was put into use, some dancers worried whether wearing a headset is harmful to their ears or whether they could all hear the same music at the same time. They found this wasn't a problem at all.

Originally a small team with a few dozen people when it was founded nine years ago, the Nanning Dream Team is now a large square dance group with 121 members. Members are from Guangxi, Shandong, Chongqing and other places and are all retirees above 50 , with the oldest 82 years old.

Their daily hour-long square dances are held from 8-9 pm.

Besides their regular evening dancing, the dancers also enter will provincial dance competitions in Guangxi and travel together.

Many Chinese netizens and media accounts have forwarded video of the Nanning Dream Team square dancing with their headsets to support them, thinking it is a practice worth expanding nationwide.

# Barbara Caroline Clemence

Barbara C. Clemence died peacefully on Friday, May 10, 2019 at Anne Arundel Medical Center. She is survived by six children, eleven grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. She was a longtime member of St. Matthew's United Methodist Church in Bowie.

On September 17, 1931, she was born Barbara Caroline Wight in the house her father had built in Johnston, Rhode Island. On July 1, 1950, she married G. Vail Clemence. Barbara first spotted her future husband Vail when she was five, seeing him from an upstairs window during an annual summer camp. It was the earliest moment of a childhood friendship that grew into a lifetime together; when he passed away in 2017, they were in their 67th year of marriage.

Barbara formed her own 4-H chapter to teach other girls the arts of cooking and sewing. She played piano starting in childhood; by her teen years she was serving as accompanist for the children's Sunday School songs at Belknap Chapel,

She would go on, as an adult, to play and sing for the local Choral Society in Manassas Park, Virginia. When they moved to Newport News, she directed and accompanied both the youth choir and an "Up with People" young people's performance group at Denbigh Presbyterian Church, where she also served inthe adult choir as singer and pianist.

Music was central in the Clemence household. Family singalongs took place in the living room, where two pianos shared space with a trumpet, trombone, clarinet, flute, melodica, accordion, several harmonicas and guitars, a banjo, a drum kit, and a small pump organ. Her children especially treasure memories of her sitting down with their father to play piano
duets, and of his picking up his trombone or guitar to accompany her as she played and sang one of the songs they loved that were popular from the turn of the century to the fifties and sixties.

Her childhood expertise with a sewing machine also proved invaluable through the years, as she designed and stitched together countless school costumes, Halloween costumes, and theater costumes for her singing and acting brood. And later, during the years she and Vail danced with the Bowie Square Cats, she created coordinating costumes they'd wear to the group's full- dress square dance and round dance evenings.

But of all her gifts, none was more special than her talent for relationships. She had an uncanny knack for connecting with strangers and making lifelong friends wherever she went. It was a talent she exercised for a number of years as a volunteer with the Gallup organization, conducting in-field polling in any kind of weather, in every kind of neighborhood, meanwhile, never slackening her pace as a busy mother of six who over the years virtually never missed a pick-up or drop-off of her children for whatever intricately-scheduled activities filled each hectic day. .

Perhaps the most significant example of the way she invested herself in the lives of others comes from her retirement years, when for 13 years she and Vail led the volunteer organization FISH of Greater Bowie, devoted to providing routine and emergency transportation for seniors in need. SAGE STUFFED CHICKEN

| 1 | Tbsp. | Olive Oil, plus more | 8 | Fresh | Sage leaves |
| :--- | :--- | :--- | :---: | :--- | :--- |
| 4 | 5 oz. | Chicken breasts, boneless \& skinless | $1 / 2$ | Tsp. | Salt |
| 8 | Thin | Slices prosciutto | $1 / 2$ | Tsp. | Pepper |
| 8 | Thin | Slices Fontina cheese |  |  |  |

1. Preheat the grill to high and brush with oil.
2. Place a chicken breast on a work surface and slice horizontally in half. You will have 2 thin breasts for a total of 8 .
3. Place each breast between 2 pieces of plastic and lightly pound to $1 / 8^{\text {th }}$ inch thickness, taking care not to tear the chicken.
4. Place a slice of prosciutto, a slice of fontina and a sage leaf on each piece of chicken.
5. Beginning with the narrow end, roll up the chicken and secure with toothpicks.
6. Brush the rolls with oil and sprinkle with salt and pepper.
7. Grill the rolls, turning occasionally, for 7 to 11 minutes, depending on their size or until browned on all sides and cooked through.
8. Transfer to a serving platter, remove the toothpicks and serve.

| $1 / 4$ | Cup | Sugar | 1 | 13 oz. | Jar Stonewall Kitchen Wild <br> Maine Blueberry jam |
| $11 / 2$ | Tbsp. | Cornstarch | $1 / 2$ | Tsp. | Cinnamon |
| 2 | Pints | Blueberries * |  |  |  |

1. Or $2-14 \mathrm{oz}$. bags of frozen fruit (not defrosted).
2. Preheat oven to $425^{\circ}$. Butter a $2-3$ quart baking dish.
3. Combine sugar, cornstarch, lemon zest, cinnamon and jam. Gently stir in blueberries. This is the base of the cobbler - one bowl.
4. Prepare pastry:

| 1 | Cup | Flour | $1 / 2$ | Stick | Butter |
| :---: | :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- |
| 2 | Tbsp. | Sugar, divided | $1 / 4$ | Cup | Lt. cream, $1 / 2 \& 1 / 2$ or milk |
| $11 / 2$ | Tsp. | Baking powder |  |  |  |

5. Combine dry ingredients, flour, 1 tbsp. sugar and baking powder; and then cut in butter (may pulse in blender).
6. Add dairy product and mix until dough pulls together.
7. Break off pieces of dough and flatten slightly, laying each in an irregular pattern on top of the fruit. Since it makes 6 servings, I make 6 small biscuits.
8. Sprinkle 1 tablespoon of sugar on top.
9. Bake for $25-30$ minutes until pastry is lightly browned and berries hot.
10. Serve with whipped cream, ice cream or yogurt.
P.S. Great with any fruit: peaches, mixed berries, etc.
